

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

PARASITE, *Journal de la Société Française de Parasitologie*, publishes, in English and in French, original contributions, research notes, information (letters to the editor, books analysis), congress reports and commissioned reviews dealing with specific topics. All aspects of parasitology are concerned, including basic or applied research in such fields as entomology, helminthology, protozoology, epidemiology, ecology, therapeutics, immunology, molecular biology, genetics...

PARASITE is an international publication. Manuscripts from researchers belonging to every countries are welcome, whether they are members of the French Society of Parasitology or not. Submission of a manuscript implies it is original and has not been submitted elsewhere for publication. The authors undertake to request the publisher's agreement before reproducing even only a part of the article in another publication. The main author must provide a written confirmation of all the co-signatories' agreement regarding the publication of their article in PARASITE.

Three hard copies of the manuscript and the corresponding computer version (text, figures and tables on separate files) should be sent to: Dr Jean-Marc Dumas, 64 avenue du Général de Gaulle, F-92130 Issy-les-Moulineaux. It will be registered under a reference number. Original contributions and research notes will then be submitted to the anonymous appreciation of two referees, before acceptance by the Editorial Board. Should the paper be rejected, the original will be sent back to the authors, together with the reviewers' reports.

Original contributions will be written in French or English. They will be limited to 25 pages, illustrations included, typed on A4 paper with 25 double-spaced lines a page, and 60 letters and spaces a line. Authors should follow International Rules for Nomenclature.

Papers should be organized as follows :

- a. A title-page will mention the title of the article (limited to 150 characters), the authors' names and initials of surnames (limited to 6), the name and address of the institute where the work was done, a list of key-words in French and in English; e-mail, fax and telephone numbers of the author responsible for correspondence should be indicated. A running title of no more than 50 characters should be added.
- b. To keep the authors anonymous, the first page of the text should begin with the title one more. A 8 to 15 lines summary will be provided in French, English and eventually in the author's language, together with a translation of the title.
- c. Please arrange the text in : Introduction – Materials and methods (enough information must be given to enable other investigators to repeat the experiments) – Results – Discussion – Acknowledgements – References.
Only references cited in the text (author's name, date) and accepted for publication should be listed at the end of the paper in alphabetical order, according to the following examples :

- d. Nomenclature : the authors must follow the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature (ICZN, 1999, 4th ed.). When a taxon is quoted in the text for the first time, it must be followed by the authority of taxon and its date of creation. The bibliography must only contain the references quoted in the text. However, in papers of systematics, the authors may choose either to quote the references concerning the authorities of taxa or not.
- e. Figures and black and white photographs with legends which are supplied with a text must be scaled in microns or millimeters. Their location must be indicated in the text as well as the eventual reduction wished by the author.

Therapeutical protocols and animal experiments will be led according to the regulations in force and are the authors' responsibility.

Commissioned Reviews, which will not exceed 35 typed pages, and Research notes, limited to 6 typed pages and 250 words for each summary, will globally obey the same instructions.

Letters to the editor will be limited to 2 pages and published on agreement of the Editorial Board. Some case-reports can be published under this heading.

Technical costs

- Once the manuscript accepted, € 195 will be asked for to the authors to face publication costs. In return, the correspondence author will receive 25 reprints and the .pdf format of the article. Any additional copies should be ordered at the proof stage and enclose the corresponding payment.
- Above 8 pages, each printed page of original contributions will be charged 100 euros.
- The additional cost related to four-colour reproductions will be at the author's expense.
